and the white one Salt.

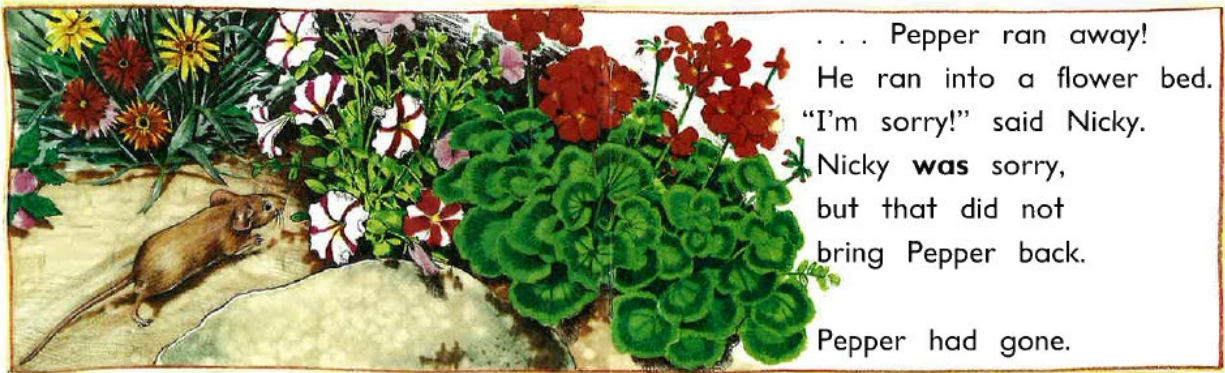


Dad made a big new cage

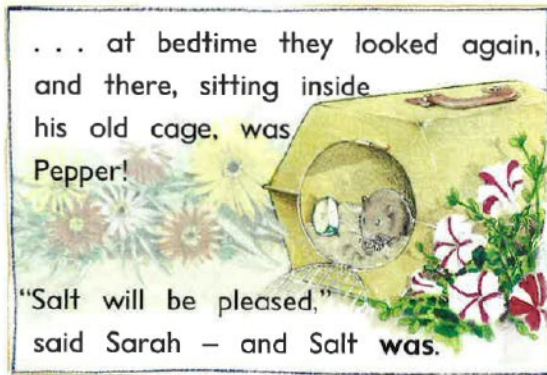
Mom and Sarah put the cage down in the flowers. They opened the door, but Pepper did not come.

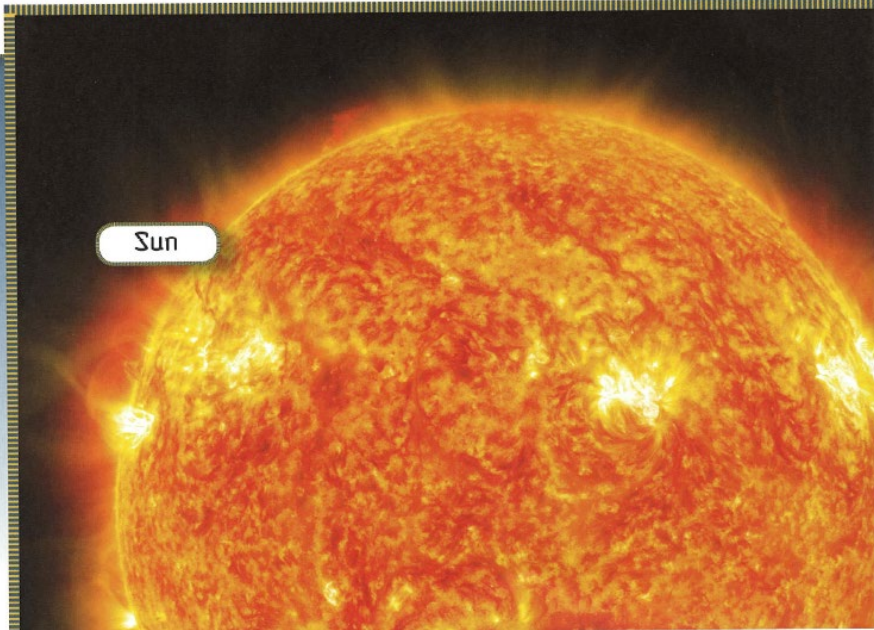
Look up at the sky on a dark night.

You can see some *stars*, too.



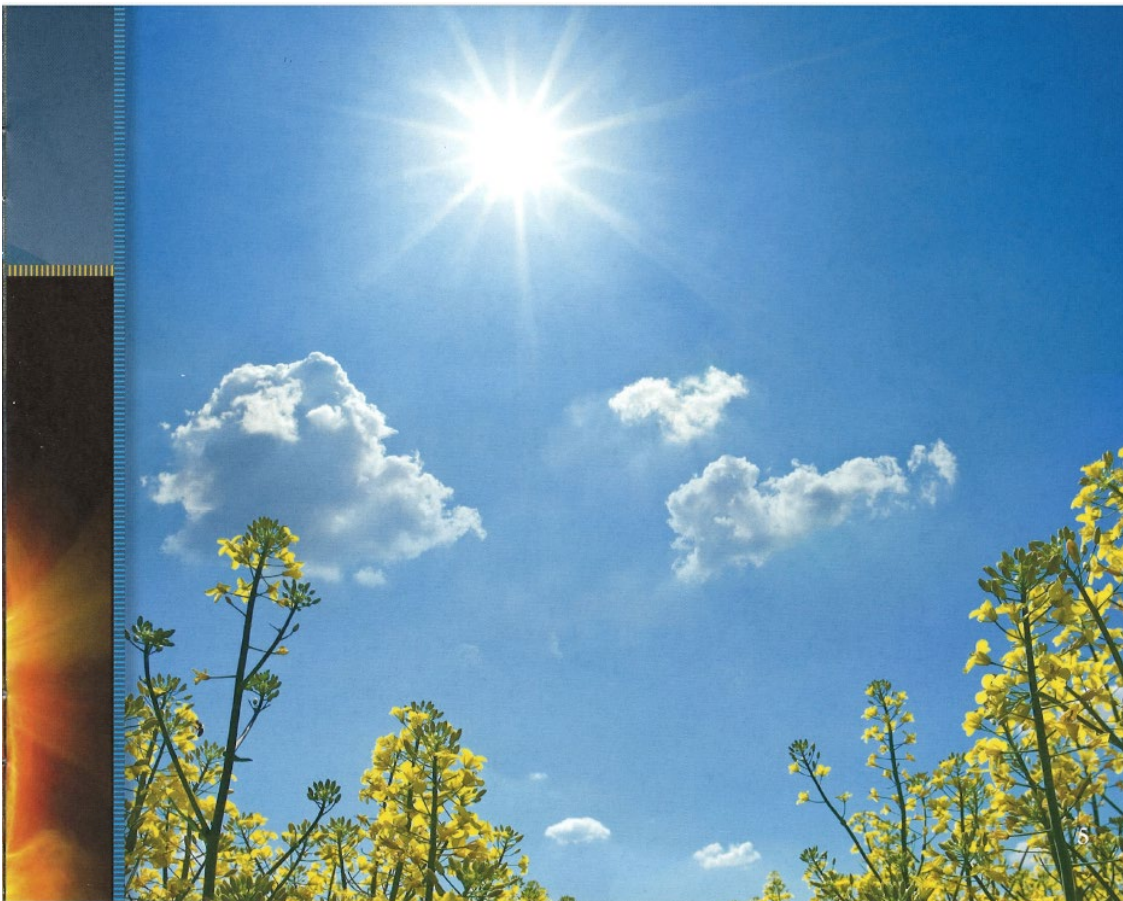
We live on a planet called *Earth*.

The Sun gives us *heat* and *light*.



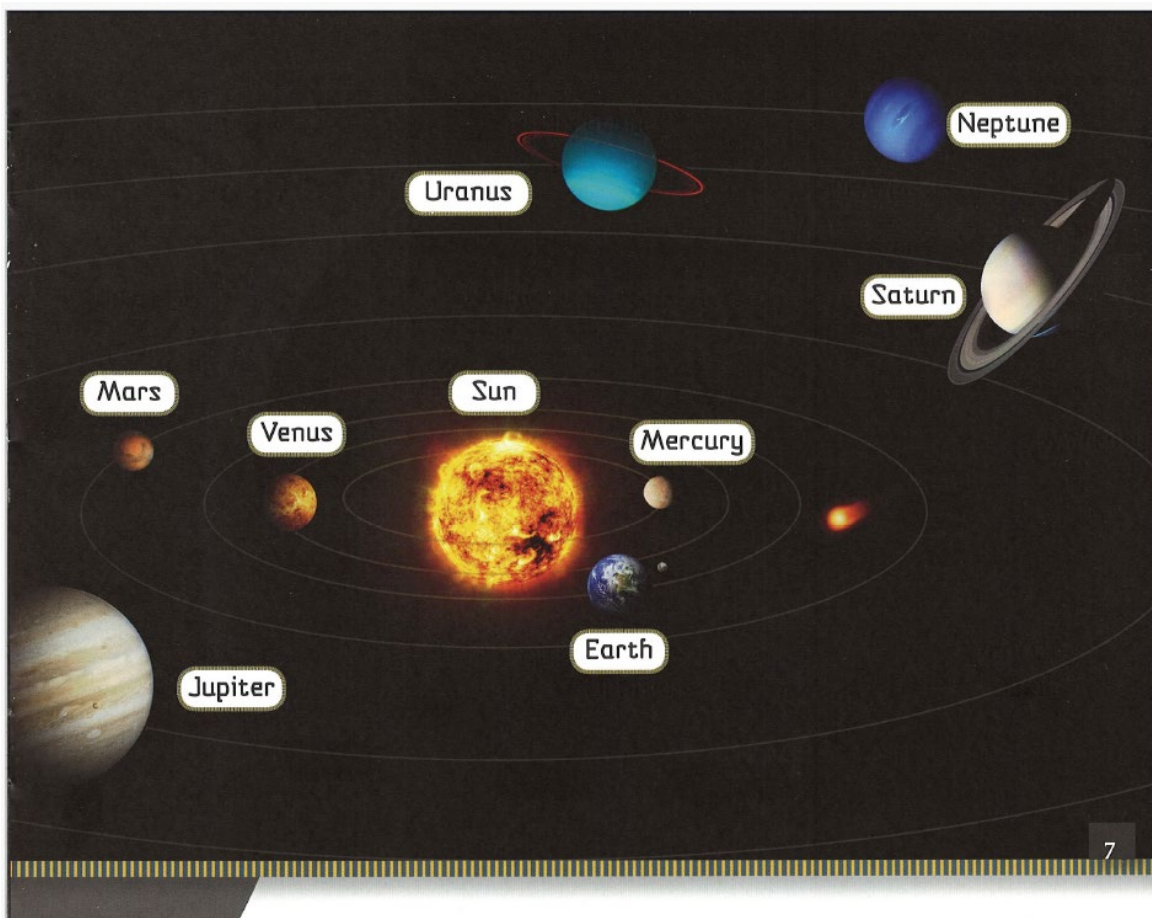

that move around our Sun.

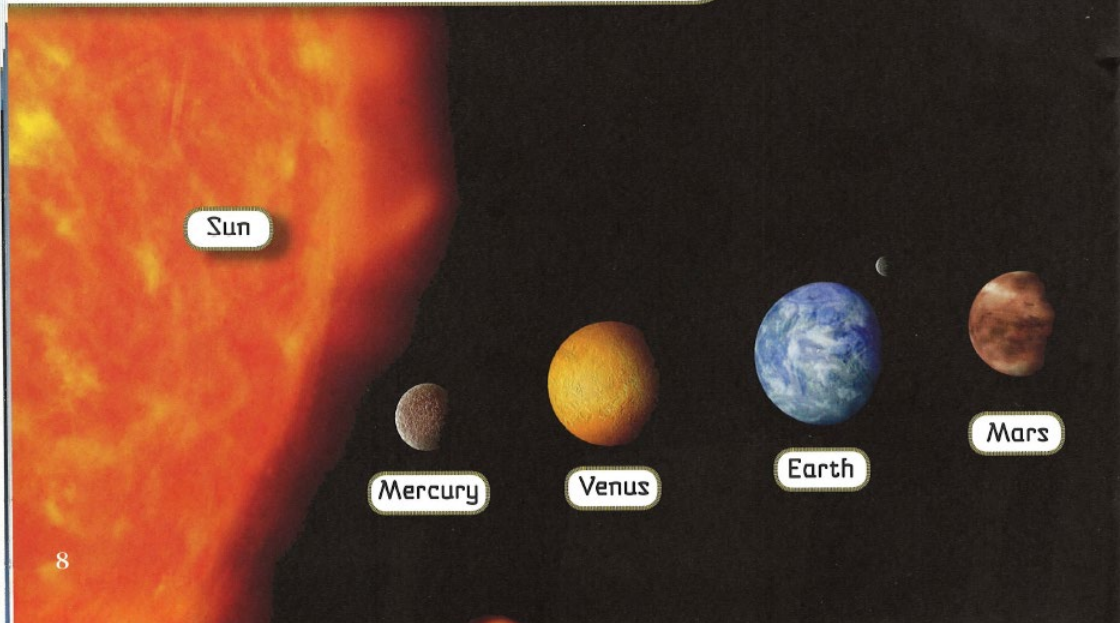
The Sun and planets make up our *solar system*.

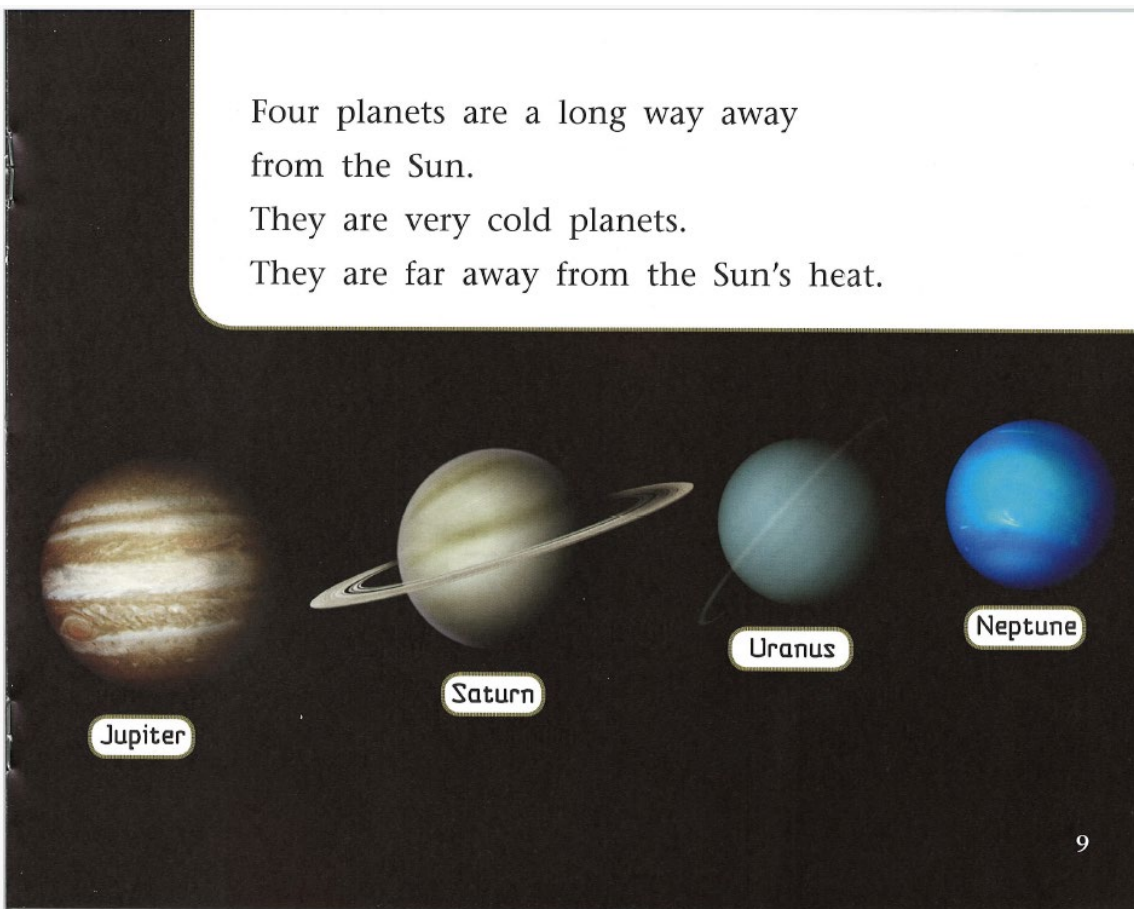

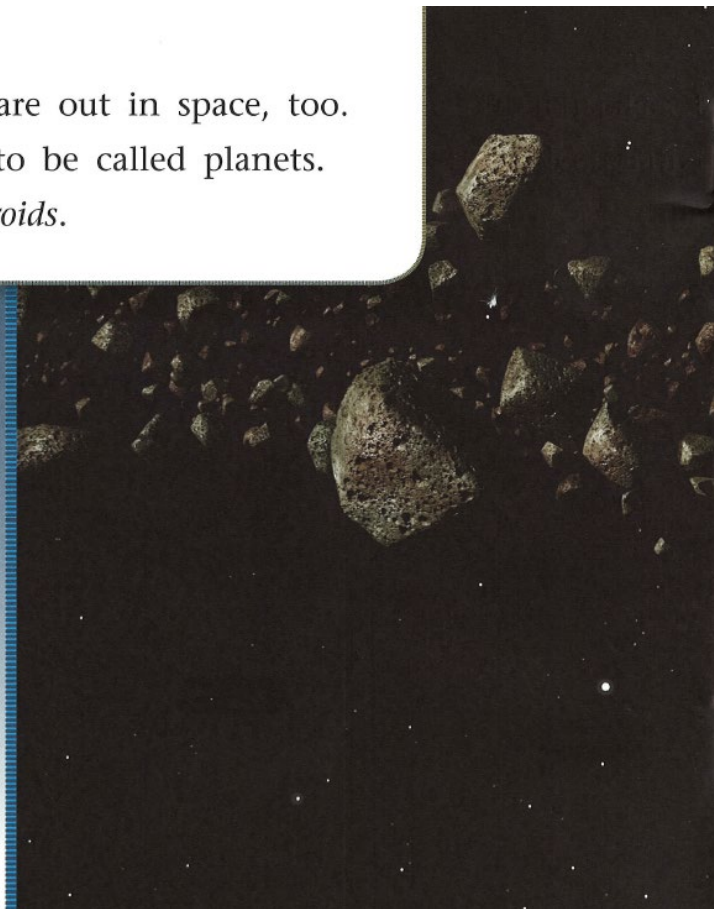
Four small planets are near the Sun.

They get a lot of the Sun's heat.



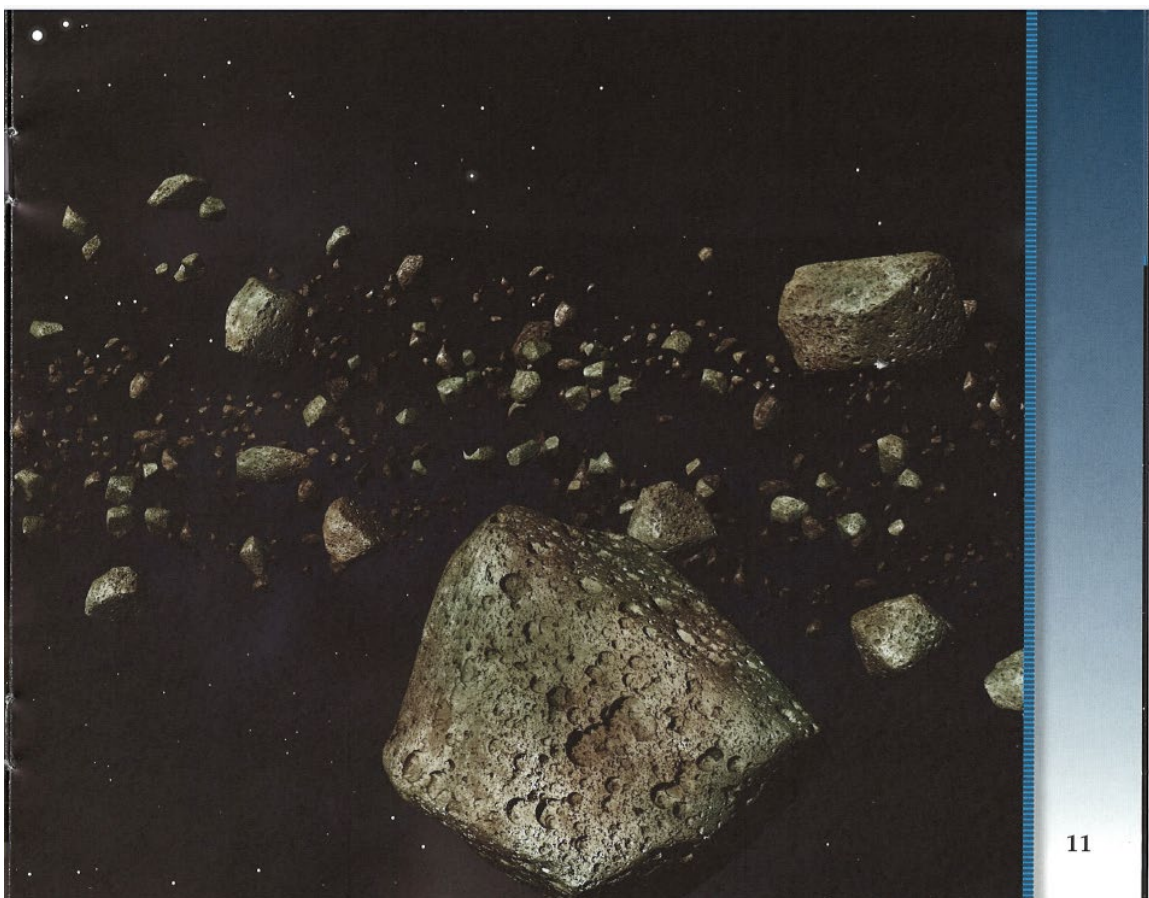
Four planets are a long way away

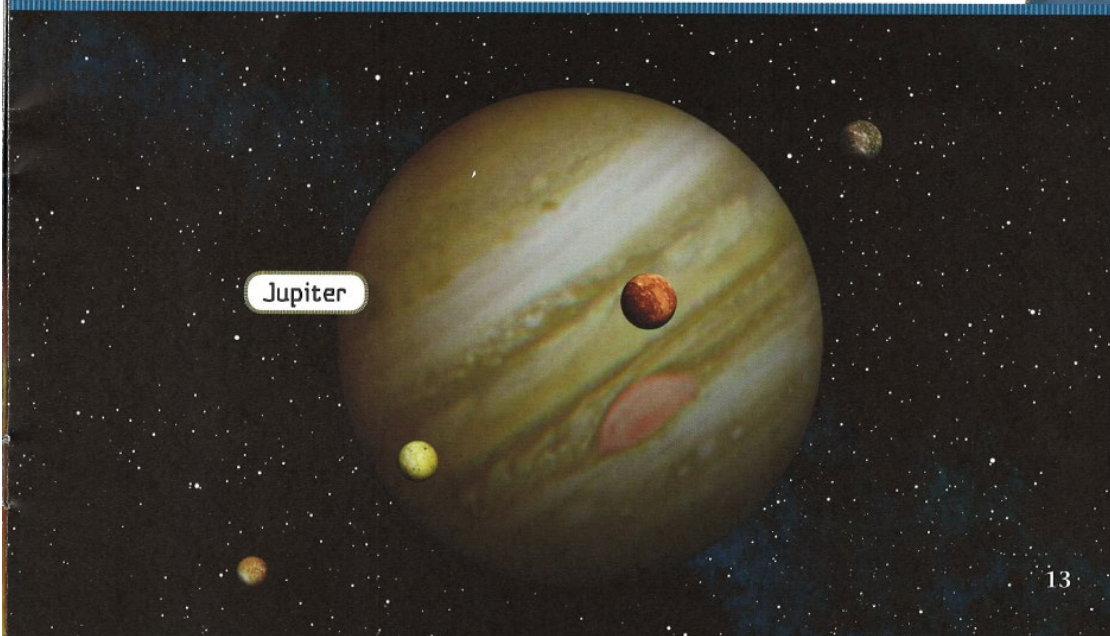

There are moons that move around other planets, too. Some planets have more than one moon.

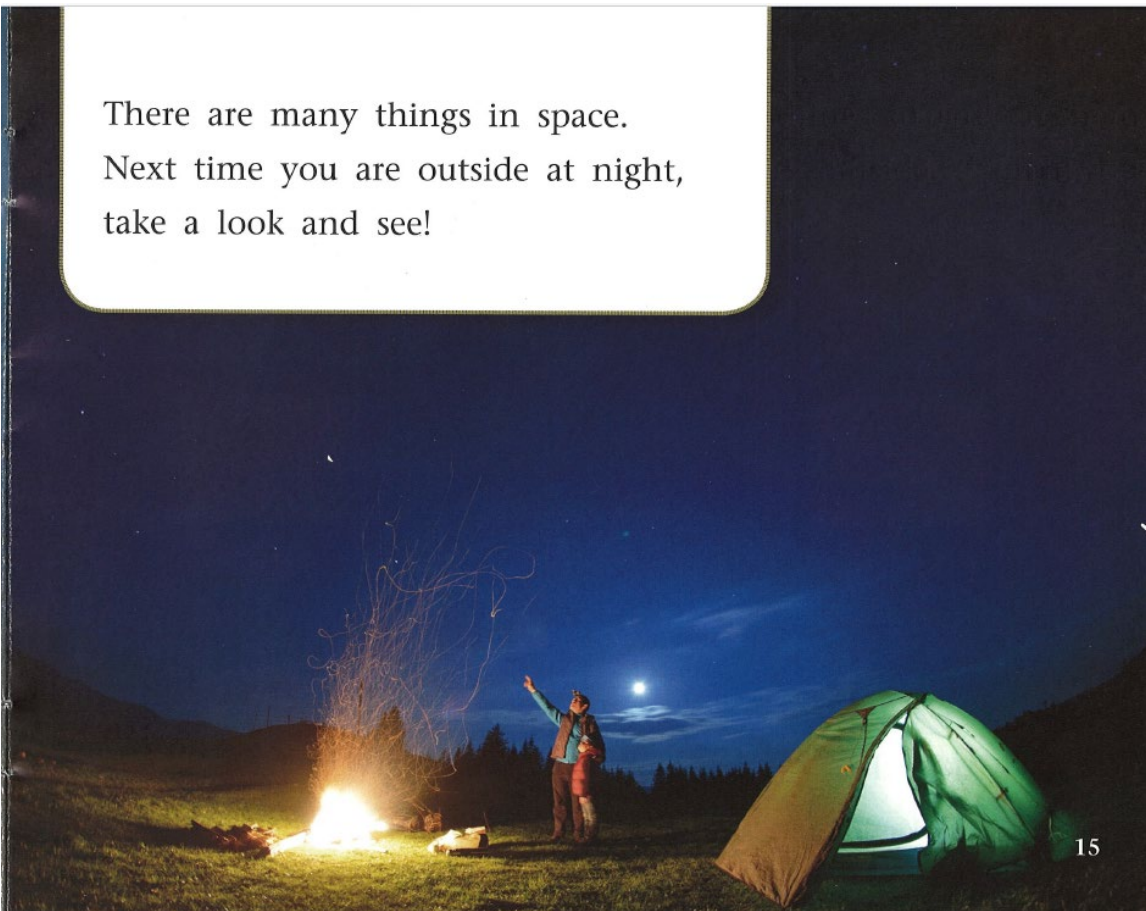

take a look and see!



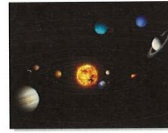

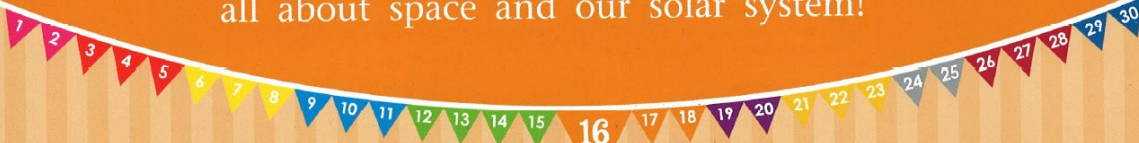
