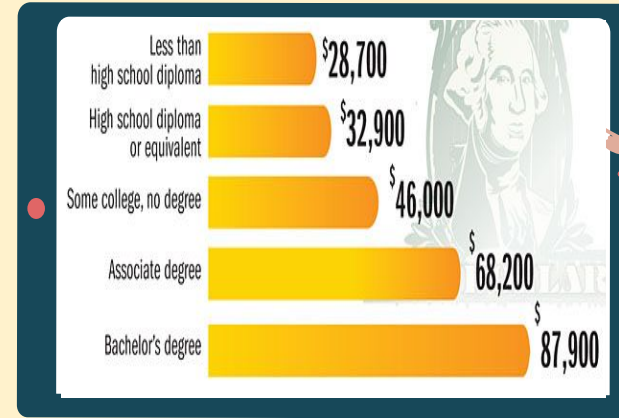

- 16 MTC Graduates

Who's in, Who's out?

Requirements for Dual Enrollment:

- Meet minimum score on required Accuplacer enrollment exams
 - 3.0 GPA can be used as a qualifier for reading requirements
 - SAT/ACT/PSAT scores can be used; check with MTC for most up to date requirements
- Be in good standing (3.0 GPA or greater, no failure due to attendance within 1 calendar year, and no classroom based discipline resulting in ISS or greater consequence within 1 calendar year)
- Complete and submit all enrollment paperwork on time, resulting in acceptance to the college
- Complete course requests for a minimum of 2 offered dual enrollment courses each term
- Complete annual college orientation, including verification of access to course management system and email
- Maintain academic progress by completing courses
- Note: Students seeking to obtain an Associates of the Arts degree must begin course work in the fall of the 10th grade year. Students must successfully complete the course sequence required each year (10th-12th), totaling 61 credit hours.
- Students who participate in the dual enrollment program must maintain good standing with the program. This includes earning at least a “C” in all Midlands Technical College courses, not having excessive absences, and/or must not have dropped a dual enrollment course during a previous semester. Failure to maintain these requirements will result in a minimum of one semester suspension from the program, or up to the time needed to be instated by MTC. Ultimately, MTC must approve readmission.

***Students should contact the college to which they intend to attend, to ensure courses transfer.*

- **Checking In - Arriving or staying on campus. The media center is your homebase for these times. Seating in the media center is one per table.**
 - You are expected to "check in" to the media center within the first 15 minutes of class using a link posted in the **Dual Enrollment Google Classroom (code: hxxhwn4s)**. If you arrive later, please check in to the main office and then report to the media center.
 - If you need to work in the computer lab or with a teacher, you should use the same link, indicate where you are going, and then report to the location you noted.
- **Checking Out - Leaving campus**
 - To leave campus you must have a note on file. This note is for "open" times only. It does not serve as an all the time dismissal pass. Please submit notes to Mrs. Roberts. If you do not have a note, you are required to stay at school; you cannot leave with someone else.
 - If you have a note on file for the term, you are expected to "check out" using the same link posted in the **Dual Enrollment Google Classroom (code: hxxhwn4s)**. Once again, this should be done on break or during the first 15 minutes of class.
 - If you come back to school early, check back in using the "check in" process above.
 - If you need to check out after the first 15 minutes, regular check out processes through the main office should be used.
- A timestamp and your student account are recorded when you check-in/check-out; do not forge a check in or check out for any other student. Failure to properly document arrival to or leaving from campus will result in disciplinary action and loss of these privileges.

To whom it may concern:

You are receiving this letter because you have a child in the BLHS Dual Enrollment program in partnership with Midlands Technical College who has been identified as a priority concern at midterm reporting. Priority concerns are students identified with missing work or with low test scores, which could result in course failure. I am sending this letter to make you aware of what has been shared with BLHS from MTC. BLHS does not have access to your child's grade book; however, you can ask your child to log in to D2L and view the grade book within each course to gain a better understanding of his or her progress.

Due to the nature of this situation, I wanted to alert you to some options and consequences moving forward:

1. **Saving the grade:** I recommend reviewing the syllabus and list of assignments, putting all due dates on a calendar, and checking MTC email daily. Additionally, students should reach out to the MTC instructor and ask to make a plan for making up work or other opportunities to improve grades. It is not guaranteed that the instructor will be open to this, but it is a better strategy than trying nothing. Typically, the final exam is highly weighted, meaning there is still time to save the grade if you do all the little things right between now and then. Remember, these courses have a +1.0 weight, so essentially even if the final grade is a 70 (2.0), the high school GPA for the course is a 3.0.
2. **Dropping the course:** To protect the MTC GPA, students can withdraw from the course and receive a W on the MTC transcript until exams begin. Once MTC exams begin, this option ends. However, per high school policy, **students electing to drop or who are dropped by the instructor after the drop/add period will receive a WF/51** for the course recorded on the respective high school transcript for the course. Students seeking to drop a course should contact their counselor to begin this process.

Failure Early Warning Letter

*Mailed to parent and emailed to student

3. Consequences:

- a. MTC - MTC places students on academic probation for failure to maintain an overall 2.0 college GPA. If the student continues to fall below a 2.0 GPA the following term, the student will be suspended from MTC. Students placed on academic suspension will not be allowed to take classes for one semester and must apply for readmission.
- b. BLHS - Students who participate in the dual enrollment program must maintain good standing with the program. This includes earning at least a "C" in all MTC courses, not having excessive absences, and must not have dropped a dual enrollment course during the previous semester. Failure to maintain these requirements will result in a minimum of one-semester suspension from the program, or up to the time needed to be reinstated by MTC. Ultimately, MTC must approve readmission.
- c. Degree status - If the course failed is one that is needed for earning an Associates Degree or General Studies Certificate, the student will need to plan with a guidance counselor to learn more about options for retaking the course if he/she wishes to continue pursuing a degree. If the student is a graduating Senior, there is no option to recover the degree or certificate prior to graduation.

Students earn their way into the Dual Enrollment program through a record of academic success. I know the pace and structure of college classes can be challenging, but I believe each student can work to improve his or her grades and make the best of the current progress. As the dual enrollment coordinator, I am here to support however I can from the high school side. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

Advice from MTC



- **Pre-plan and work as far out in advance as possible (a year ahead of time ideally) – this gives colleges an idea of how many courses and sections will be needed and time to assign appropriate faculty if being taught by college instructors (and time to vet any high school instructors who may teach courses)**

More responsibility on their part (ex: they need to speak with professors if they have issues/concerns; know deadlines; follow syllabus); encourage DE information sessions, admission workshops, and orientation sessions to ensure students have every opportunity to hear important information**
